- 2. For payment
- 3. For our health care operations
- 4. To make sure we are providing good services
- 5. To let you know about other treatments or services
- 6. To remind you of appointments

Biltmore Medical Associates May Use and Share Your Patient Health Information (PHI) Without First Giving You an Opportunity to Agree or Object:

- 1. To comply with the law
- 2. To promote public health
- 3. To comply with court order, subpoena, or legal request for your PHI
- 4. To help law enforcement purposes
- 5. To determine cause of death or for purposes of identifying you, should you die
- 6. For organ, eye or tissue donation purposes
- 7. For medical research
- 8. To promote safety or prevent danger
- 9. To provide information to specialized government functions (military, national security and intelligence, and other heads of state)
- 10. To help correctional institutions or law enforcement authorities having lawful custody of you

Under HIPAA, You Have the Right:

- 1. To request restriction on use and disclosure of PHI
- 2. To request different ways to communicate with you
- 3. To see and copy your PHI
- 4. To request amendment of your PHI
- 5. To have disclosures made of your PHI
- 6. To have a copy of Biltmore Medical Associates Notice of Privacy Practices
- 7. To file a complaint about our Privacy Practices
